

## CREATING A CULTURE OF CARE

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Professionals in the Dean of Students Office work with students, their families, faculty, and staff to:

- *Derive success plans and provide ongoing support for students in distress dealing with a variety of issues.*
- *Help students complete the necessary medical petition paperwork for all courses or medical drops before or after the drop deadline for a medical withdrawal and seek support resources for those issues.*
- *Address a broad range of complaints either through directly assisting the student involved to resolve the issue, working with the student to contact the appropriate personnel, or referring the student to resources or offices that can directly address the issue. Follow-up is provided to the student until the situation is resolved.*
- *Assist students, their families, faculty, and staff with concerns through [umatter@ufl.edu](mailto:umatter@ufl.edu) seven days a week.*










# OF RETROACTIVE






### FIRST YEAR FLORIDA

# of students registered for FYF




### FALL FAMILY WEEKEND



## ENCOURAGING RESPONSIBLE STUDENT CONDUCT

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When incidents happen, primarily on campus, and UF students are involved, our office is the main university entity that works with students to resolve disciplinary matters. We also ensure that students receive fair treatment in all hearings. Students, faculty and staff who believe there has been a violation can contact Student Conduct and Conflict Resolution at the Dean of Students Office to discuss options available for reporting incidents to the appropriate authorities. Office staff can assist victims of assault or harassment by a University student, and they are also available for educational programs on a variety of related topics.






## NOTETAKING PROGRAM


